1. BACKGROUND

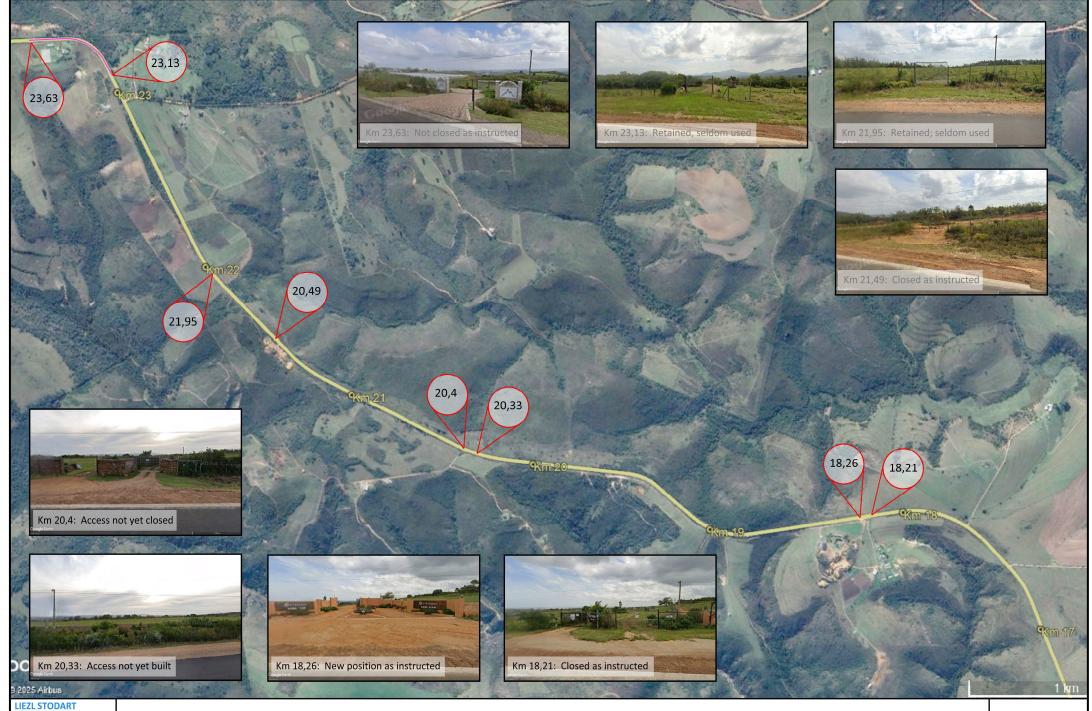
- Figure 1: Outeniqua Game Farm No. 373 and Outeniqua Farm B No. 420 Mossel Bay | Locality Plan

This transport impact assessment accompanies the environmental authorisation application for the Outeniqua Game Farm on Farms 373 and 420 in the Mossel Bay district. The property is located to the west of Trunk Road 3302, about seven kilometres north of Brandwacht and seven kilometres south of Ruitersbos. The property obtains access off Trunk Road 3302. The location is shown in *Figure 1*, *Annexure B*.

The property is about 1380 hectares in extent and is currently zoned for agricultural use. The proposed land use is in line with the current zoning.

2. DEVELOPMENT PROPOSAL

Land use approval was granted in 2022 for consent to establish a function venue, and for a temporary departure to provide a chapel. The current environmental application is for the rectification and approval of unauthorised activities on the property.

The development currently comprises:

- A working agricultural farm of which a section is used as game farm, with associated farm buildings;
- Dwellings for farm workers, the owners, and other employees;
- A chapel with a maximum capacity of 90 persons:
- A restaurant with a maximum capacity of 100 persons.

The layout is shown on the Site Development Plan (*Figure 2*, *Annexure B*). The tourist facilities and some residences obtain access off TR3302 via the main gate at Km 20,26. The eastern part of the farm obtains access from TR3302 at Km 20,4. The western part of the farm obtains access from the Haelkraal Road (DR1604) via Minor Road 6433 (OP6433).

3. EXISTING ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE

Information on the existing road infrastructure was obtained through a site visit conducted on 21 September 2025. The only road affected by the development is Trunk Road 3302. This road is a surfaced road with one lane per direction and surfaced paved shoulders. The speed limit in the vicinity of the game farm is 100km/h. The Annual Average Daily Traffic volume on TR3302 is about 1350 vehicles.

4. COMPLIANCE WITH CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

The area between Brandwacht and Ruitersbos is very hilly, and TR3302 has many vertical and horizontal curves where it passes the Outeniqua Game Farm. This limits the positions where a accesses with sufficient shoulder sight distance can be located. In a series of letters from the Provincial Roads Engineer, instruction was given that certain accesses had to be closed, relocated or new accesses provided. The site was inspected to confirm whether these conditions had been complied with. The instructions and compliance status are summarised in *Table 1*.

The relocation of the Km 20,4 access was halted by the Environmental Authorities, as the new access position would have required a new road which would qualify as a listed activity. A request for the relocation of the access and the provision of the new farm road will be included with the environmental application that is currently underway. Once environmental approval has been received, the design for the new access will be submitted to the District Roads Engineer.

5. DEVELOPMENT TRAFFIC IMPACT

Trip generation rates as recommended in the COTO TMH17 Trip Data Manual were used to calculate Outeniqua Game Farm development trips. It should be noted that the restaurant and chapel will never be open at the same time. The trip generation potential is summarised in *Table 2*. The generated trips were distributed onto TR3302 as shown in *Figure 3*, *Annexure B*.

Trunk Road 3302 traffic volumes were obtained from the Western Cape Road Network Information System website. The generated trips were added to existing traffic volumes. The resultant volumes are shown in *Figure 5*. Low existing traffic volumes on TR3302 means that there is significant spare capacity on the road. The addition of Outeniqua Game Farm trips will cause no change in service levels. It can be concluded that the Game Farm will have a low traffic impact.

6. ACCESS GEOMETRY

The new main access at Km 18,26 complies with the relevant spacing and shoulder sight distance requirements. The need for an exclusive right turn lane was measured against the Western Cape Access Mangement Guidelines warrants for right turn lanes. As shown in **Diagram 1**, a right turn lane will not be warranted.

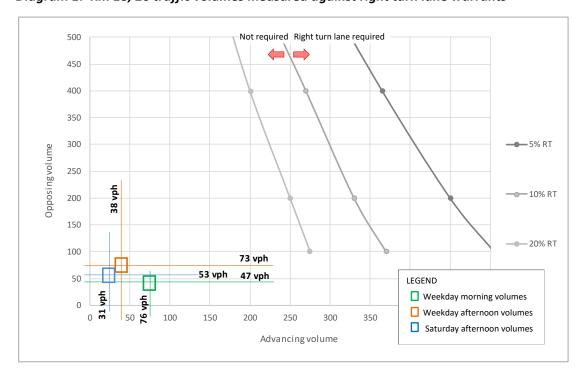


Diagram 1: Km 18, 26 traffic volumes measured against right turn lane warrants

The new access at Km 20,33 will be designed and constructed according to the Western Cape Government construction drawings and regulations. The design will be submitted to the District Roads Engineer as soon as environmental authorisation has been obtained for the development.

7. CONCLUSIONS

It can be concluded that the Outeniqua Game Farm development has a low traffic impact. Other conclusions are summarised below.

- The development consists of a working agricultural farm (a part of which is reserved for game), homes for owners and employees, a restaurant and a chapel;
- The property is situated next to TR3302, about halfway between Brandwacht and Ruitersbos;
- The Western Cape Provincial Roads Engineer previously indicated where access could or could not be obtained;
- The main access at Km 18,21 was relocated to Km 18,26 as instructed;
- The relocation of the Km 20,4 access was halted by the Environmental Authorities, as the new access position would require a new road which would have qualified as a listed activity;
- A request for the relocation of the Km 20,4 access and the provision of the new farm road will be included with the environmental application that is currently underway;
- Once environmental approval has been received, the design for the new access will be submitted to the District Roads Engineer;
- The restaurant and chapel will never operate simultaneously. The maximum anticipated number of trips will be 65 trips (30 in, 35 out) during the weekday afternoon peak hour;
- An exclusive right turn lane is not warranted.

8. RECOMMENDATIONS

The recommendations made in the transport impact assessment are summarised below:

- The new access at Km 20,33 should be designed and constructed according to the Western Cape Government construction drawings and regulations;
- The design should be submitted to the District Roads Engineer as soon as environmental authorisation has been obtained for the development.

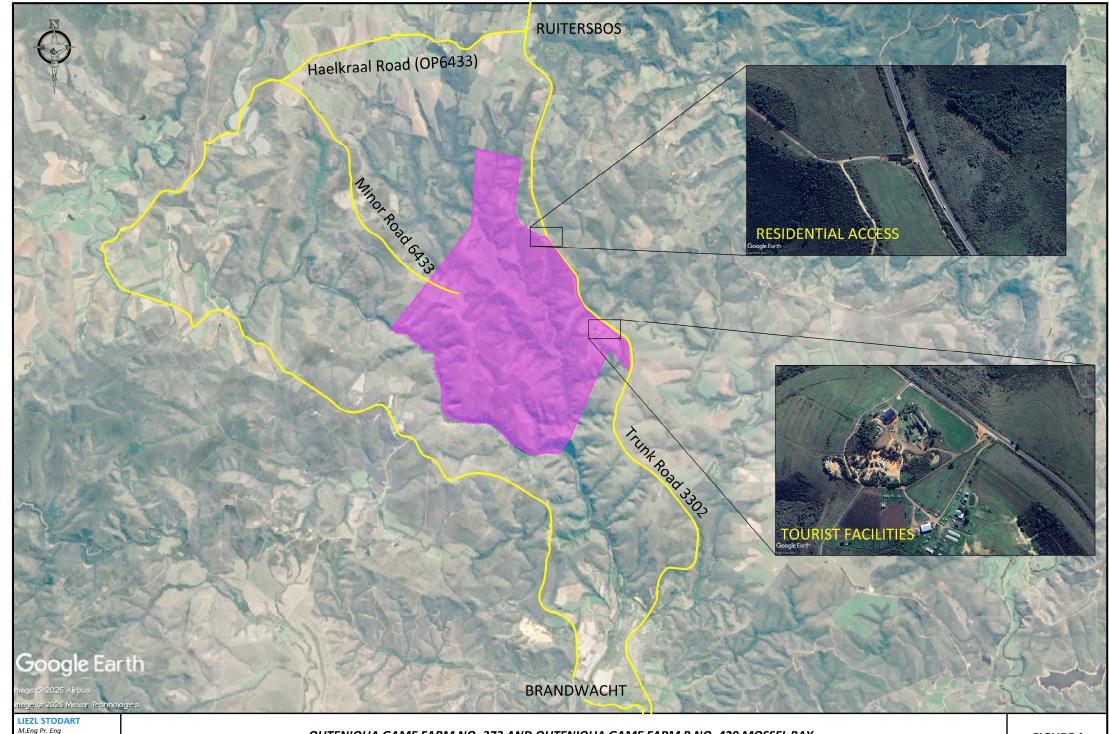

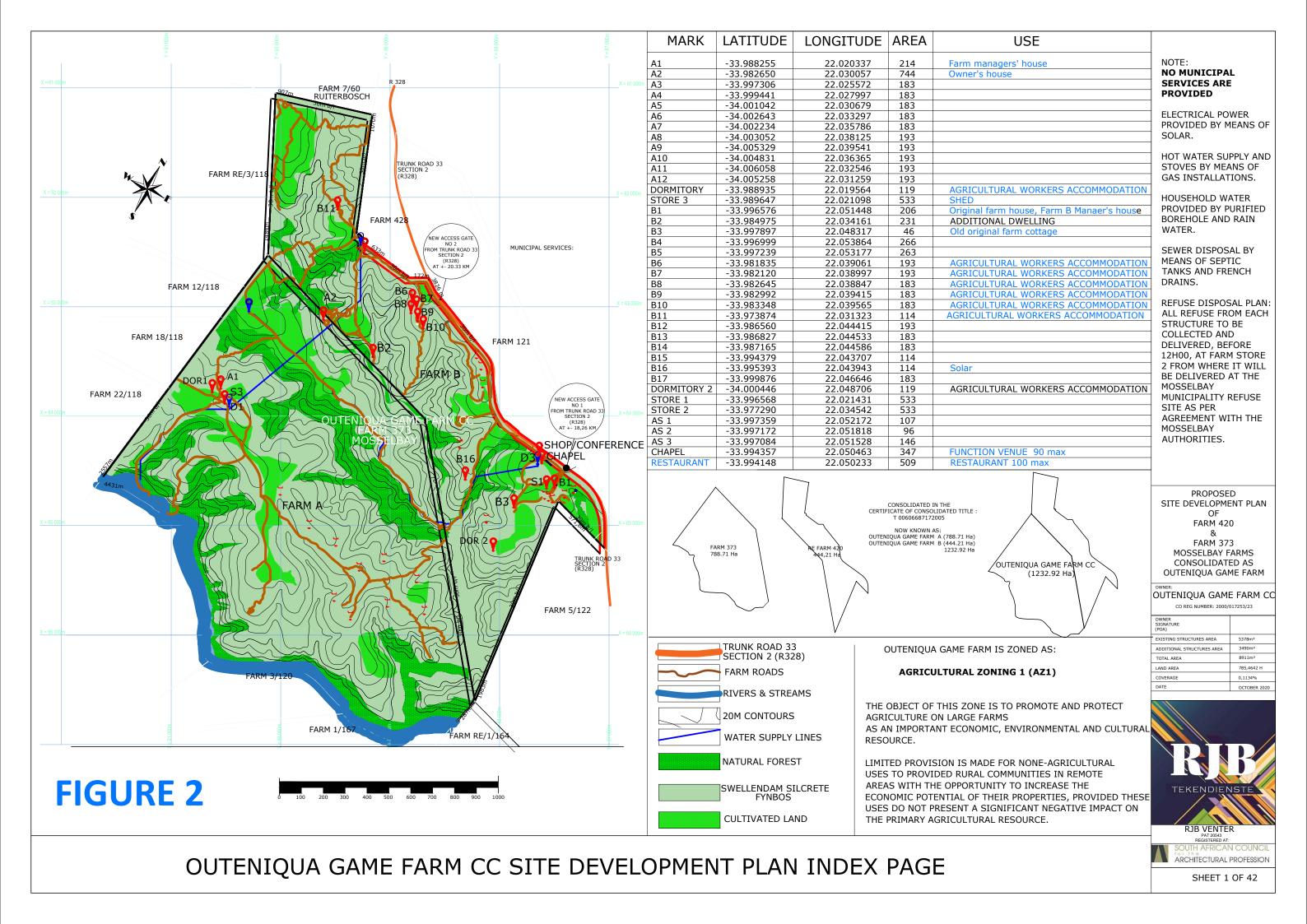
